Chartered in December 1931, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Kappa Zeta Chapter was established upon the principles of Service, Scholarship, Sisterhood, and Finer Womanhood. Kappa Zeta Chapter celebrates over 75 years of leadership, service, and commitment to our community through its members and its 501©3 charitable arm, Stork’s Nest Charity Fund of Dallas (SNCFD).

Through this charitable arm, Kappa Zeta Chapter has made significant contributions to the Dallas and surrounding Metroplex communities via volunteer work and outreach services. More specifically, monies donated to SNCFD are used in the granting of scholarships, maintaining child care development centers, deploying youth (ages 4-18) development projects, as well as sponsoring service programs geared towards women’s and children’s health issues. Kappa Zeta chapter is able to annually award an average of \$5000 to deserving high school seniors. This year, we are pleased to announce the availability of two additional scholarships.

The Kappa Zeta Chapter has served the Dallas Community since our chartering in 1931 and as an organization of college educated women we continue to volunteer and give back our services to our community.

Purpose

The scholarship is to be awarded to high school seniors who exhibits high academic standards and who does not have the technology to be successful at a 4 year college or university.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Must be a high school senior.
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (4 year college).
3. Must have completed at least 10 community service volunteer hours.

The Scholarship Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will receive a scholarship of a technology bundle. There are two options. Option 1 consist of a laptop, laptop bag and 3 in 1 printer and print cartridges. Option 2 consist of a 3 in 1 printer, print cartridges, Microsoft Windows Suite and a flash drive. The winner will be notified by March 10, 2012. The winner will be honored during a special program in March 2012.

Submission of Application

Materials should be submitted in the following order:

1. completed application with photo attached (passport photo)
2. student biography/resume
3. brief statement of why applicant is deserving of this award and how he/she will use this technology in his or her academic career
4. two letters of recommendation with one being from your school counselor
5. an official high school transcript
6. documentation of volunteer hours: document volunteer hours in this format.
